**PARTICIPATION**: Open to all HSL member schools that have paid their HSL membership dues and

submitted their signed membership form.

# **EVENTS**

1. <u>STORYTELLING (ST)</u>: No manuscripts may be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the title and author of the selection. Selections must be from published or printed sources. Students are encouraged to use the floor space. MAXIMUM TIME: 8 minutes.

- 2. <u>PROGRAM READING (PR)</u>: Manuscripts *must* be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the titles and authors of each selection. MAXIMUM TIME: 10 minutes.
- 3. <u>HUMOROUS (HI)</u>, <u>DRAMATIC (DI)</u> and <u>DUO (DUO)</u> <u>INTERPRETATION</u>: Manuscripts cannot be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the title and author of the selection. Selections must be from published sources. MAXIMUM TIME: 10 minutes.
- 4. ORIGINAL ORATORY (OO): Manuscripts cannot be used; presentations must come exclusively from memory. Manuscripts must be the original work of the student and copies of orations must be submitted to the Tournament Director by the deadline. No more than 150 words of the oration may be direct quotations from any other source. MAXIMUM TIME: 10 minutes.
- 5. <u>IMPROMPTU SPEAKING (IS)</u>: Topics will include quotations, sayings, one-word items, personalities in the news, song titles, etc. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. PREPARATION TIME: 5 minutes. MAXIMUM TIME: 5 minutes.
- 6. <u>U.S. EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEAKING (USX)</u>: Topics will cover U.S. foreign policy and U.S. domestic issues. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. PREPARATION TIME: 30 minutes. MAXIMUM TIME: 7 minutes.
- 7. <u>INTERNATIONAL EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEAKING (IX)</u>: Topics will cover foreign policies and actions of many countries, including the United States. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. PREPARATION TIME: 30 minutes. MAXIMUM TIME: 7 minutes.

### **REUSE RULE**

Competitors who qualify for the State Forensic Championship may NOT use their winning selection or oratory again until the District and/or State Forensic Championship.

## **VERIFICATION FORMS**

The interpretation verification form, oratory verification form(s), and all orations must be received by the deadline above. Note: The original source for each selection in DI, HI, and DUO must be presented to the Tournament Director before the start of Round 1. Failure to submit the original source will result in a last place ranking for the contestant.

#### LIMITS

Each school may register a maximum of four (4) entries per event with a maximum of eighteen (18) total entries. DOUBLE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.

#### **FEES**

\$7.00 per participant. As a reminder, Duo Interpretation entries must be paid according to number of participants, not number of entries.
